## **HOW WE ARE HELPING**

The Foundation has continued to provide practical support and financial assistance to people living with MND outside of their day to day direct medical needs.

Both directly and through our long-standing relationship with MNDA, we have been able to provide over 30 grants and support 20 families across the South West.

Help ranges from providing iPads and communication aids, complementary health and access to dietary advice, specialist transport and counselling & bereavement support.



In one case we have been able to fund a programme of acupuncture sessions for 'Ms W' of Portishead who has been so grateful for the improvements to her physical mobility and symptomatic

relief that the treatment brings as she struggles with the onset of the disease.

We have helped a number of individuals and their families in providing various home improvements to make their lives just a little bit more manageable and enjoyable.



By way of example, we funded the installation of a new, fully accessible wet room and wheelchair ramps throughout a house for 'Mr P' in Weston Super Mare. His wife commented "We cannot thank you enough for such a generous grant. It will make such a difference to him being able to access the outside world in his wheelchair".
